




HUMANITIES RESEARCH AMONG LEAST CITED AFTER FIVE YEARS

A recent *Times Higher Education* article reported on differences in the volume of uncited research in various disciplines. A five-year analysis of bibliometric data from Elsevier's Scopus database found that authors in the fields of chemistry or neuroscience were almost always cited after five years. Conversely, much of the research in the arts and humanities remained uncited after five years. The article suggests that differences in citation culture among fields may be a factor in this variation and describes recent efforts to determine an article's impact by using more than citation counts.
